

Island Hopping – Deer Island & Campobello

The Littles Sisters of the Bay of Fundy – Deer Island and Campobello

St. Andrews is the perfect home base for this day adventure! The Islands will capture your heart with breathtaking views and unspoiled nature at it's best. You can also hike along the trails, walk the beaches, birdwatch and explore lighthouses. When International borders are open, you can also return via the State of Maine. **Drive/Ferry time: 3 hours + exploring time!**

Please note limited services of gas stations on the islands so please make sure you gas up. Eateries available during the summer months. Leave St. Andrews and take Route 127 East, direction Saint John. Merge onto the TC Hwy #1 until exit 52 through the lovely Town of St. George or wait until exit 56 – for a more direct route and follow Route 172 all the way to the Deer Island Ferry (47 min).



The two ferries pass each other in the Bay as they run every 30 minutes to and from the mainland and Deer Island. No charge. Ferry crossing time is 20 minutes.



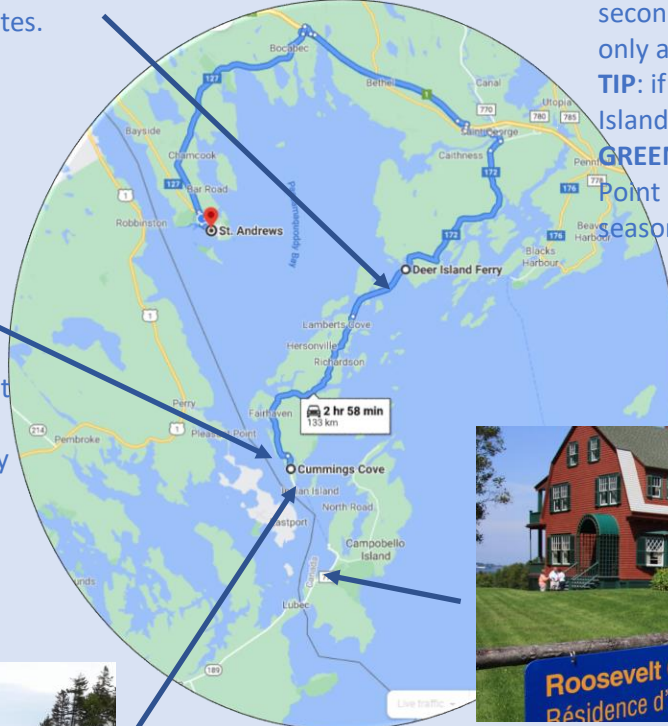
Travellers Tips!

TIP: find this iconic drive on Campobello en route to the Head Harbour Lighthouse also known as East Quoddy Lighthouse- the second oldest in the province - a lighthouse only accessible at low tide!

TIP: if you are early – drive past the Deer Island mainland ferry landing to the **GREEN'S POINT LIGHTHOUSE** 185 Green's Point Rd, L'Etete. Its' onsite museum is open seasonally. FB: GreensPointLighthouse



Deer Island is home to the largest tidal whirlpool in the Western Hemisphere – the Old Sow, easily seen from the Deer Island Campground beside the Campobello ferry landing and best 3 hours before high tide.



East Coast Ferries operate the 15 car ferry between Deer Island and Campobello. Schedule and Fees www.eastcoastferriesltd.com. Ferry crossing time is 20 minutes.



Campobello Island is also home to Roosevelt Campobello International Park. The Summer retreat for the Roosevelt family for over 56 years and a favourite of US President Franklin D.
