**TIP:** Can't-miss spots to dine are everywhere! Try the clams!



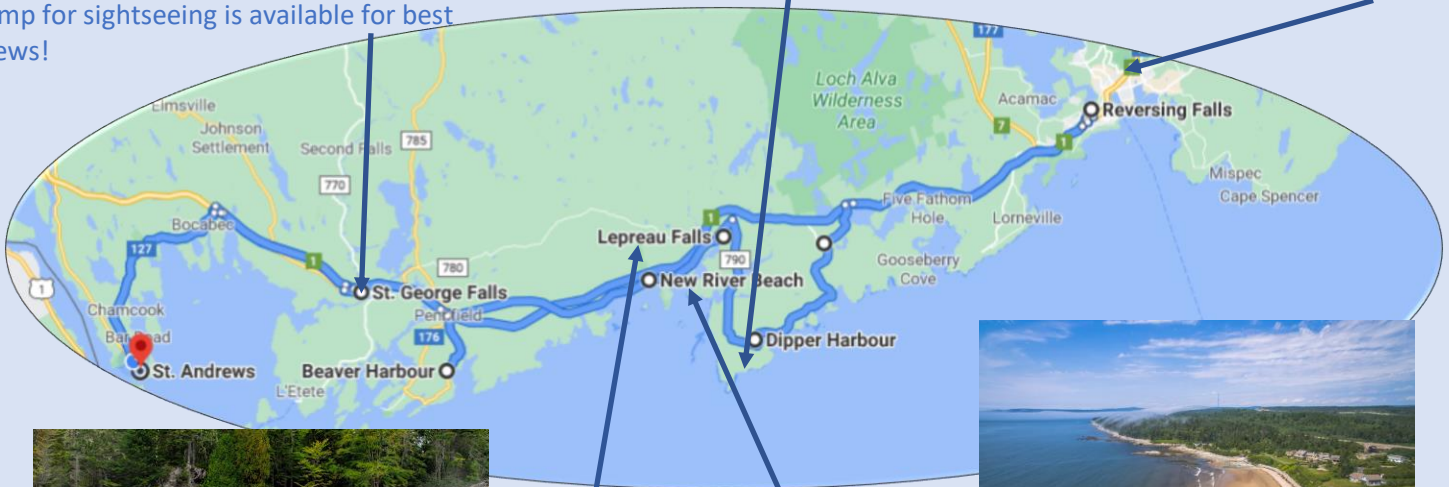
**Point Lepreau Lighthouse** sits on between Dipper Harbour and Maces Bay and the boundary between 2 counties. To the northeast you should be able to see Point Lepreau Nuclear Reactor a CANDU operated by NB Power.



Twice each day 100 billion tons of water, a volume equal to all of the world's rivers ... enters and exits the Bay of Fundy in Saint John. **Reversing Falls Rapids** is a Natural Wonder with an equally incredible and much older geological story. Two ancient continents meet here in the gorge. The dark volcanic rock originated in today's Africa and is about 515 million years old and the light grey rock is marble formed from ancient sea creatures. Once called First Falls, the original name of the town, the St. George Falls are worth a visit. Explore the gorge, watch for osprey overhead, or observe Atlantic salmon manoeuvring the fish ladder. A vantage ramp for sightseeing is available for best views!



**Lepreau Falls** These falls would be the highlight of all waterfalls on the Lepreau System. If there is only one fall on the Lepreau River System, see this one. The access is easy it's part of a small walk. Take Route 795 off of the old Route 1 for about 1.9 km. Turn right onto Lepreau Falls Road and go about 400 m and you will see Lepreau Falls.



**New River Beach Provincial Park** is the perfect spot admire breathtaking coastal islands. The beaches and coastal trails at New River Beach abound with spectacular evidence of the natural formation of the bay's high tides. Unsupervised saltwater beach, two circuits of hiking trails. Admission for some areas.
