

A Sweet bit of History

Charlotte County is home to Canada's oldest family-operated candy maker – Ganong Bros. of St. Stephen. Take a day trip around to see this and some of the highlights of history in our area!

Leave St. Andrews and take Route 127 West, direction St. Stephen. Take Route 170 just before the highway and bumble along the coast until you come to Todd's Point Road. Turn LEFT to Ganong Nature Park. (25min) After the Park take the Ledge Road into St. Stephen, Left on Prince William and the RIGHT on Milltown Blvd. for the Chocolate Museum. (12 min) Have Lunch in St. Stephen at one of the many eateries from 5Kings to Carmen's Diner. There will be no gas stations or eating sport between St. Stephen and McAdam, so fill up for the trip! After lunch pick up Prince William Street to NB Route #3. Stay on the #3 until you reach Thomaston Corner where you need to turn LEFT to McAdam (58 min).

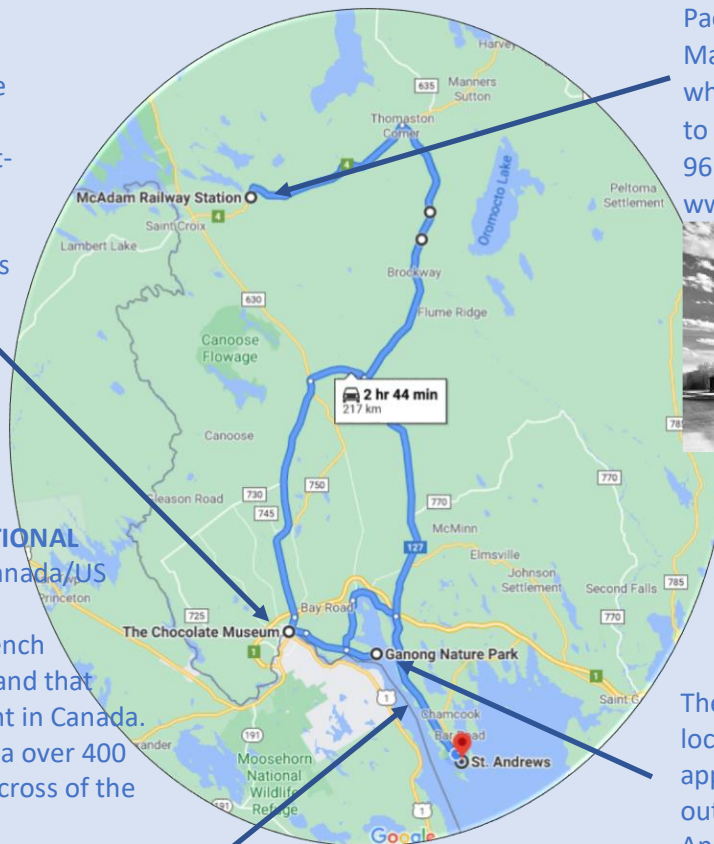
Enjoy your time at the McAdam Railway Station. Retrace your drive to the #3 in Thomaston Corner then right onto NB Route #127 and straight back to St. Andrews. (55min) **Bonus Stop:** If you have time, on the way back to St. Andrews, take a moment to stop at the St. Croix International Historic Site. **Drive Time: 2:44 hours + exploring time!**



The Chocolate Museum

Located in what used to be the original Ganong candy factory, The Chocolate Museum offers an interactive way to learn about candy making in St. Stephen. A must-see for all Chocoholics! ST. CROIX ISLAND INTERNATIONAL HISTORIC SITE One of two Canada/US international historic sites, it commemorates the 1604 French settlement on a mid-river island that founded European settlement in Canada. The first settlement in Canada over 400 years ago. . It overlooks the cross of the St. Croix River and St. Croix Island where, in 1604, Pierre Dugua, Sieur de Mons attempted to establish one of the first year-round French territories in the North. THE MCADAM RAILWAY STATION

The McAdam Railway Station is a rare example of a Canadian Pacific Railway passenger station with a built-in hotel. Their collections represent over 120 years of Canadian Pacific history in New Brunswick and Maine. It's a story of railroad history when ridin' the rail was the only way to travel!
